COVID-19 Basic Preventative Measures

Wash hands with soap and water or disinfect using alcohol

These are the most effective ways to get rid of germs and viruses that are hiding in the crevices of your hand. Make it a habit to wash your hands after going out. These basic infection prevention measures are effective for preventing infection from not only the novel coronavirus, but also other types of viruses.

🕨 Cough Etiquette

- 1 Cough away from other people
- 2 Wear a mask if you are developing coughs or sneezes
- 3 If you cough/sneeze into your hands, wash your hands immediately

Get plenty of sleep and eat a balanced diet

Sufficient sleep and a healthy diet are key in strengthening the body's immune system!

Keep the air moist and rooms well-ventilated

Mucous membranes become weak when the air is dry, which increases your chances of getting infected. Use humidifiers to keep the environment at 50-60% humidity and ventilate indoor areas regularly.

Avoid crowded areas and wear a face mask

The elderly, those with underlying health conditions, fatigued or sleep-deprived persons should especially avoid unnecessary travel to crowded streets or areas. If you must, make sure you wear a face mask and limit the time that you spent in those areas.

Application for Postponement of Pension Contributions for Students

If you are a student above 20 years of age currently enrolled in the National Pension System and your income is below a certain amount, you are eligible to apply for a postponement of contributions. Applications open from April 1st onwards.

The granted period will count as qualifying periods for the Disability Basic Pension, Survivors' Basic Pension, and Old-age Basic Pension. For Old-age Basic Pension, while the period will count as qualifying periods, the period will not be reflected to the old-age benefit amount. Please note that the granted period may not count as qualifying periods for the above-mentioned benefits if an application is submitted late.

You may retroactively make payments for the periods that you were exempted contributions in the past 10 years.



Heavy Traffic at Civic Division in March & April

Heavy traffic at the Civic Division is anticipated for March and April. As it is the beginning of a new fiscal year, a large number of residents visit the city hall in order to change their addresses in preparation for job relocation or university enrollment, etc. Please prepare ample time for your visits as wait times may exceed one hour for administrative services.



Service Hours: 8:30 a.m. - 5:15 p.m.

*Reception may close early depending on the volume of traffic. *Wait times may exceed one hour.

Did you know... You can also get certificates from convenience stores?

If you have a My Number Card registered with electronic functions, you can use the card to get a variety of certificates from the Maruchi copy machines at the convenient stores.

The list of certificates that may be issued include:

- copy of Certificate of Residence (*jyūminhyō*)
- Inkan Certificate (inkan tōroku shōmeisho)
- Income Tax Certificate (shotoku kazei shōmeisho)
- Family Register Certificate (koseki shōmeisho)
- Supplementary Family Register (koseki no fuhyō)

Getting these certificates from the convenience store may save you both time and money! It costs ¥100 less to get certificate of residence (copy), inkan, income tax, and supplementary family register at convenience stores than at the city office.

Service hours for Maruchi copy machines: 6:30 a.m. – 11:00 p.m. (weekends and holidays included)

*Please note that in order to get an Inkan Certificate from the city office, you must also present your <u>Ginowan City Resident Card</u> (also known as the "Inkan Registration Card").
