

# Waste Disposal Guide



Learn about proper waste separation, disposal, and our collection schedule.

## General Rules for Disposing Household Waste



Ginowan City collects garbage from door to door. Separate your waste according to the rules shown in this guide and put them out in front of your house or in your apartment's designated garbage disposal area by 8:00 a.m. on the appropriate collection day. A complete schedule by district can be found on the back on this pamphlet.

Please note that you may only put out a maximum of 6 bags of garbage at once. Make sure to tie the bags shut.

Household garbage is separated into 5 categories:

### **Combustible Waste**



Use a city-designated garbage bag

A maximum of 6 bags may be put out at a time.

Anything that is too big to fit inside the city's designated garbage bag is considered "oversized trash" (see page 3).

Make sure to tie the bags shut.





Broken glass and other sharp objects are hazardous to the workers that collect your garbage. Please make sure to wrap them in paper and stick a "Broken Glass" or "割れ物注 意" label to the outside of the bag.

### **Oversized Trash**

\*Items that do not fit into the city's designated garbage bag are considered oversized trash. \*Any item, regardless of size, that may damage the garbage collection trucks are also considered oversized trash (e.g. bowling balls, dumbbells, etc.). Up to six items may be put out at once (with some exceptions).

A reservation for pick-up must be made beforehand via telephone. 

Monday - Friday (excluding holidays)

8:30 A.M. - 12:00 P.M & 1:00 P.M. - 5:00 P.M.

Reservations up to two months in advance may be required during certain times of the year. Please make reservations well in advance to avoid unnecessary delays.

Items under 10kg ⇒ 1 disposal ticket (300 yen)

Items over 10kg ⇒ 2 disposal tickets (600 yen)

**Step 1:** Make a reservation.

Step 2: Purchase a disposal ticket.

**Step 3:** Write your reservation date and pickup number on the blank space of the ticket.

Step 4: Paste the ticket onto your oversized trash.

Step 5: Put the item out for collection by 8 a.m.



For the bedding category only, you do not have to purchase a disposal ticket. After making a reservation, we will notify you of your pick-up number. Put your item(s) into the city's designated garbage bag and write your pickup number and reservation date on a piece of paper and paste it on the bag. —





### Recyclables

### Yard Waste (grass clippings, leaves, branches, brush, etc.)



Yard waste must be put separately in a 45L or smaller clear, plastic bag.

Processed wood products cannot be recycled. Please dispose of them as combustible or oversized trash.

Up to 6 bags may be put out at once. Make sure the bags are light enough to be carried.

#### **PET Bottles, Cans and Glass Bottles**

PET bottles, cans and glass bottles must be bagged separately by category in clear plastic bags.





**Remove** all caps and labels from PET and glass bottles. Metal caps belong to the "Non-Combustible" category.

**Rinse** all bottles and cans before putting them out for collection.

Paper products should be tied into bundles with string as shown on the illustrations on the left. You do not need to put them into a plastic bag.

Make sure to remove all plastics from all paper products prior disposal.

We cannot recycle:

- Paper cups
- **Photos**
- Carbon paper
- Thermal paper
- Paper with waterproof coating
- Oiled paper
- Envelope with plastic window

#### **IMPORTANT**



Paper cartons (must be rinsed, flattened, and bundled)

Please do not put paper out for collection on rainy days.

Paper that is wet cannot be recycled.

### Harmful Waste

Please separate them into clear plastic bags by the type of item.



Alkaline/manganese battery



Mercury thermometres



Lighters



Fluorescent tubes or compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFL)

\*CFL light bulbs have product numbers that begin with "F" or "FE".

\*Please put fluorescent tubes in a box or a case prior to disposal.



### **Recycling Home Electronics**



By law, all home electronics (e.g. refrigerators, washing machines, drying machines, air conditioners, televisions, etc., and including their remote controls) must be recycled. They are not considered oversized trash. Please contact the retail store from which you purchased the item, or call the following private recycling company.

拓南商事(株)Takunan Recycling Company TEL: 098-934-8010 (8-2 Suzaki, Uruma City) \*You must make payment at Japan Post before bringing your item to the Takunan Recycling Company.

To recycle laptops, desktops, LCD and CRT monitors, you must contact the manufacturer. They will send you a <u>Japan Post Yu-Pack voucher</u> that you will use to send in your item for recycle. Bring the voucher and item to your nearest post office or arrange for a pick-up from your home. All recycling and mailing fees will be paid for by the manufacturer.

> Any products that have the "PC リサイクル" ("PC Recycle") mark are all recyclable through the manufacturer at no charge to the consumer.

### **Disposing Spray Cans and Gas Canisters**





Spray cans and gas canisters must be emptied of its contents before disposal. Gases left in the can may case fires or explosions in the collection trucks and at the processing plant. To check for leftover gas, shake the cans. If you hear clicking, that means that there is still some gas left inside.

If you can't use up all the contents, make sure that you tape a note with the words "残量 あり" to the bag to let our workers know that the cans have leftover product in them so that they can remove the contents in a safe manner at the processing plant.

### Moving Waste to the Processing Plant By Yourself



When you need to dispose of a large amount of trash or furniture at once, you may bring the items to the processing plant by yourself. However, you must contact the Environmental Affairs Division beforehand to express your desire to do so and receive an approval.

#### Step 1:

Call the Environmental Affairs Division at the Ginowan City Hall at 098-893-4140.

#### Step 3:

Bring the items to the Environmental Affairs Division before 3:30 p.m.

#### Step 5:

Bring the items to Kurahama Sanitary Facilities Association at 3394 Ikehara, Okinawa City.

#### Step 2:

Purchase the appropriate amount of disposal ticket (see page 3) and paste onto the items you wish to dispose.

#### Step 4:

Once approved, you will be given a special permit.

#### Things to keep in mind:

- Items cannot be accepted at the facility on weekends or holidays.
- Service hours for the Kurahama processing facility is 8:30-11:30 a.m. and 1:00-4:30 p.m.
- The facility cannot accept gas cylinders, motorcycles, medical equipment, mud, concrete, lead batteries, drum cans, waster storage tanks, construction materials, etc. Please contact a private collection company.

On the back of this guidebook is Ginowan City's garbage collection schedule by district. Please put out your waste by **8 a.m.** on the appropriate collection day.

### Disposing Garbage Illegally



Leaving your garbage at disposal areas other than your own without permission is a crime punishable by a ¥10,000,000 fine or up to five years imprisonment. Burning trash in open areas is also forbidden by law.

Garbage will only be collected in designated locations within residential areas (such as in front of your house or at garbage disposal areas as designated by your apartment management company). We do not collect garbage in open areas such as in front of graves or in empty lots.
